


Dragonwings

In 1903, young Moon Shadow, 8, leaves his native China to join his father in San Francisco, where he encounters both prejudice and friendship from Americans, becomes involved in intrigue among his expatriots in Chinatown, and learns to understand his idealistic and often impractical father. Both a sensitive boy's growing-up story and a revealing historical novel, it excels in convey-

ing the immigrant experience against a background of innovation in aviation and the San Francisco earthquake.
